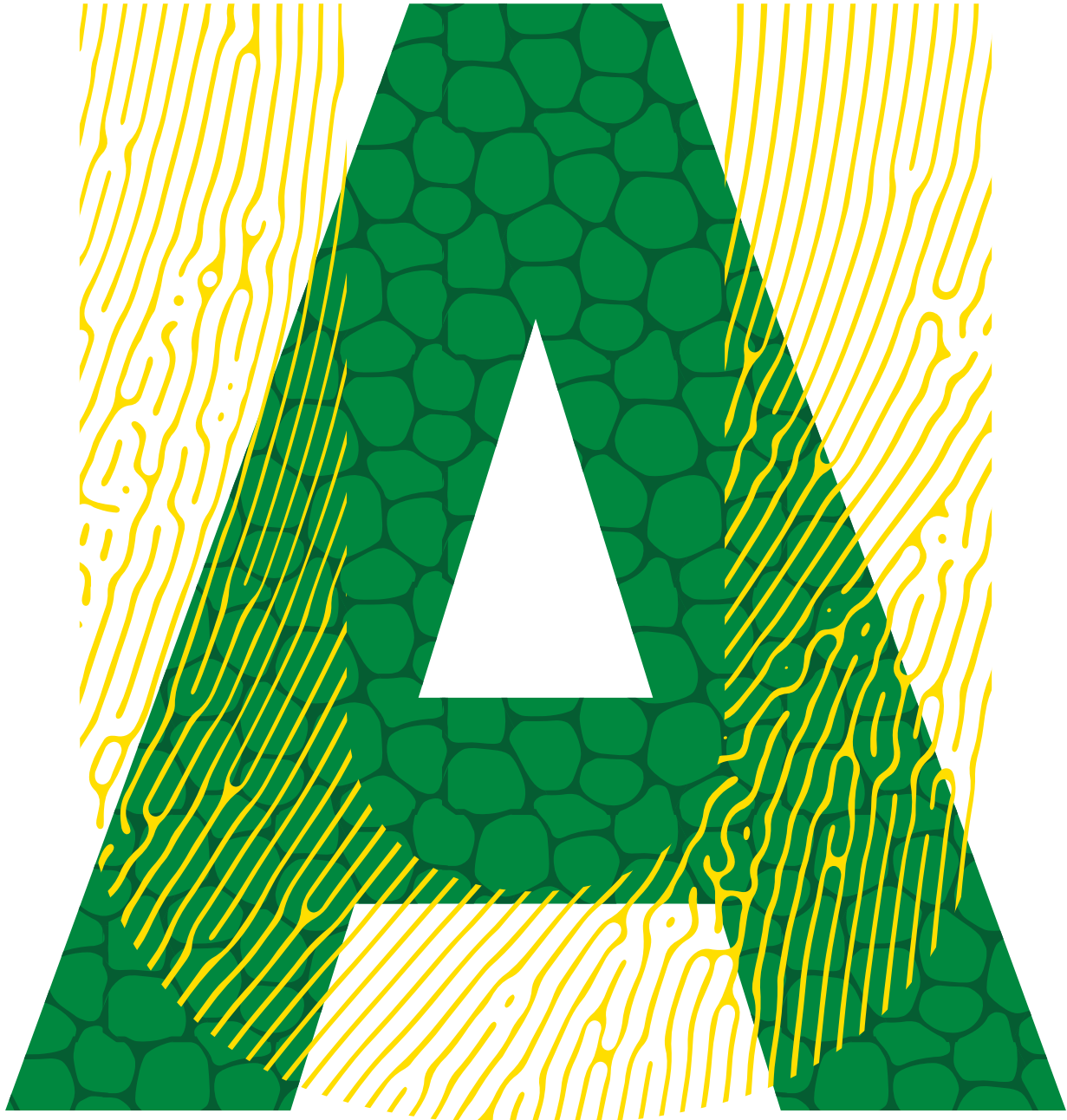

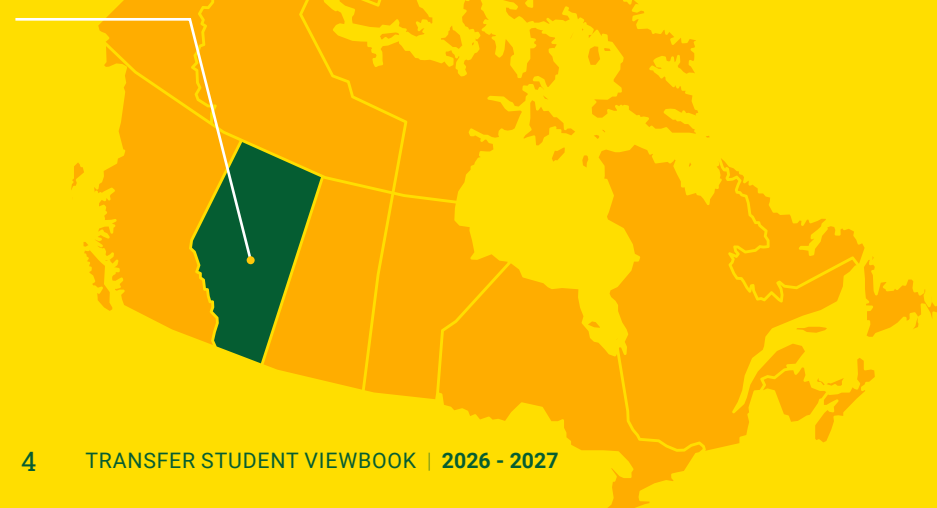
The University of Alberta respects the sovereignty, lands, histories, languages, knowledge systems and cultures of First Nations, Métis and Inuit nations.

Edmonton Folk Music Festival

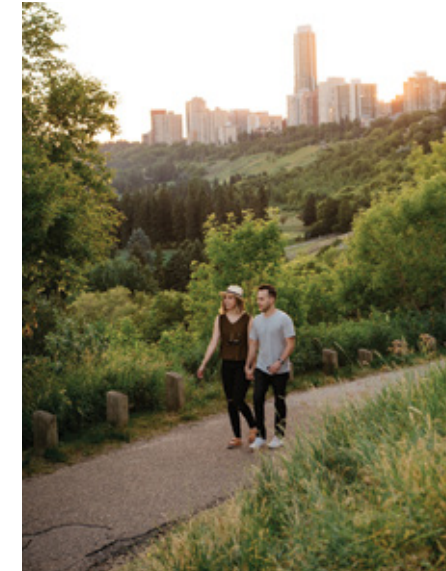
An eclectic line-up of bands from around the globe headline a jam-packed four days of folk music, great food and a stellar setting on the grassy slope down Gallagher Hill.

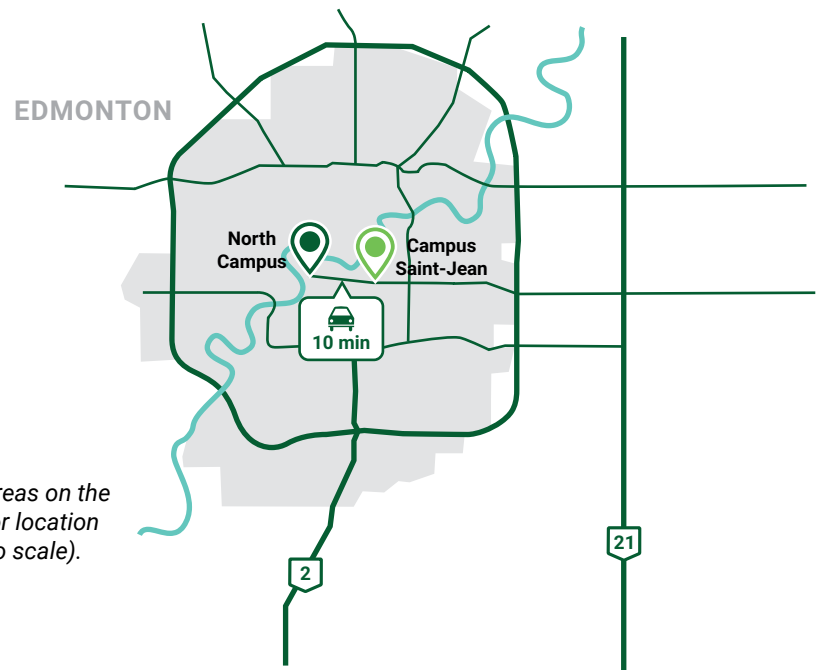

Campus areas on the map are for location only (not to scale).

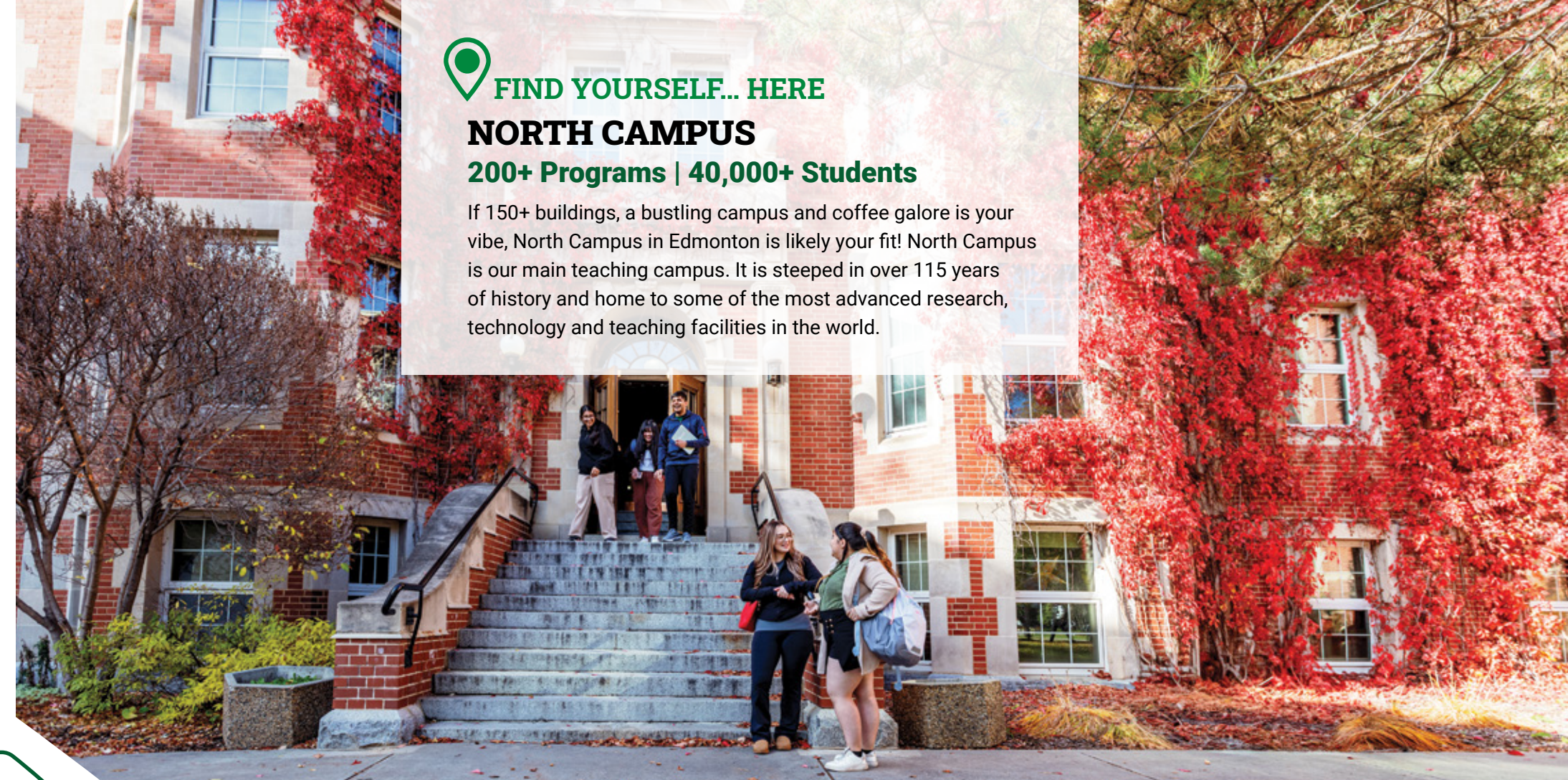
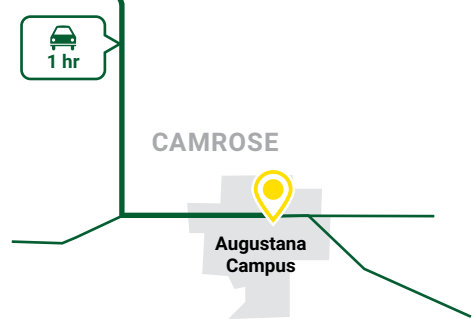
