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
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AUGUSTANA CAMPUS



MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Must have a four-year bachelor's degree from an accredited post-secondary institution.
- Admission GPA of at least 3.0 on the 4-point scale from the University of Alberta, or an equivalent qualification and standing from a recognized institution.
 - GPA will be calculated on the last 60 units of graded, eligible coursework completed, roughly equivalent to the last two years of full-time graded coursework.

APPLYING FOR AWARDS IS EASY. Just fill out a single application, and we will match you to a potential scholarship or award based on your background, experiences, academics and interests. The deadline for application-based awards is **January 10, 2026**, and you must apply to your program first.

Augustana Opportunities Award

Awarded to students with satisfactory academic standing entering the first year of an undergraduate degree at Augustana. Selection is based on indicated financial need and academic standing. Preference is given to students who are First Nation, Inuit or Métis applicants. Eight awards of \$5,000 available each year.

Entrance Leadership Scholarship

Well-rounded leaders with demonstrated contributions to their community may receive up to \$5,000.

Augustana Education Award

Students in an education program at Augustana may receive an award of \$2,500.

Admission-Based

RECEIVE A SCHOLARSHIP YOU DON'T EVEN HAVE TO APPLY FOR! Eligibility for these scholarships is based on your admission average at the time of your admission offer. We advise you to apply to your program early so we can assess you for a match to the following awards and many more.

Cora Martinson Scholarships

The Cora Martinson Scholarships are awarded to domestic and international students entering Augustana. A total of eight students per year can receive a scholarship of up to \$18,000 per domestic student and up to \$56,000 per international student (each payable over four years).

Gold Standard Scholarship

The top 5% of students in each faculty could receive up to \$6,000, depending on admission average.

Indigenous Entrance Scholarship

First Nations, Métis or Inuit applicants with an average of 80%+ may receive \$1,500.

National Achievement Scholarship

The Top Canadian students from out-of-province will receive \$30,000, payable over four years.
