Postdoctoral Fellow applicants wishing to apply for the 2025 Killam-Notley Postdoctoral Fellowship competition must complete the Izaak Walton Killam & Grant Notley Memorial Postdoctoral Fellowships Application Form and Required Document Attachments as one package and submit to the Chair or designate of their proposed Department by their own internal deadline. GPS will not accept packages submitted directly by applicants. Applicants are to confirm their eligibility and read all information on GPS' website prior to preparing an application. The deadline for Departments to nominate selected candidates to GPS is January 7, 2026. Applicants are to contact their proposed Department regarding their internal deadlines, and application and nomination status.

Application Form

Form fields are to be completed in their entirety. Applicants who have previously attended or been affiliated with the UofA as a student (undergraduate/graduate/visiting/open studies) or employee in any capacity are to indicate their UofA ID, if known.

Required Document Attachments:

Each section below **must** follow the presentation standards and page limits as stated. Submissions that exceed page limits or are missing attachments will be rejected. Submissions that do not meet presentation standards will be at a disadvantage. For questions related to the content of each section, applicants are encouraged to consult with their proposed supervisor(s). Completed form and documents are to be submitted as one PDF to the Department.

- 1) Statement of Proposed Research Project: two double-spaced typed page using a font size of 12 or greater; no exceptions will be made regarding the length. The Statement should include the following information and be written using lay language for a non-technical audience
 - The objectives of the proposed research project
 - Brief methodology
 - An explanation of the novelty and potential significance of the proposed research and the contribution that the research will make to the advancement of knowledge
 - The plan to disseminate the findings and/or enhance the potential for impact
 - References can be on additional pages

Applicants are encouraged to take into account, when applicable, diversity (gender, sex, age, culture, religion, etc.) in their proposed research (from its design to the analysis of the research findings).

- **2) Statement of Research Experience**: maximum four double-spaced typed pages using a font size of 12 or greater; no exceptions will be made regarding the length
 - References can be on additional pages
- **3) Statement of Community Engagement:** maximum one double-spaced typed page using a font side of 12 or greater; no exceptions will be made regarding the length
 - The statement should detail how the applicant engages with the community at large, both in terms of research focus/methodology and personal engagements
 - Applicants are to describe their approach and understanding of community engagement; they are to confirm they
 will engage with the community, and they are to describe they method they will use
- **4) Window of Eligibility Special Circumstances (if applicable):** maximum one double-spaced typed page using a font side of 12 or greater; no exceptions will be made regarding the length

Applies only to career interruptions in which the eligibility window can be extended for one or more of the reasons
outlined in the eligibility criteria, or for health professionals with post-degree clinical training; unrelated
circumstances provided will be redacted

5) Curriculum Vitae

- A generic CCV format is preferred but is not required
- List refereed publications or conference proceedings, beginning with the most recent
- List publications in which you are author or co-author that are published, in press, and/or accepted for publication in refereed journals
- For papers in press, indicate the date of acceptance by the editor
- Begin each entry on a new line and state the full authorship, the year, the title, the name and volume of the journal, and the first and last page numbers. The authorship should be identical to that of the original publication
- A list of any academic honors or awards
- **6) Provide a certified true copy of PhD, PhD-equivalent or health professional degree fulfillment.** If the degree has not been conferred, a signed letter from your university Registrar or Faculty of Graduate Studies (or equivalent) confirming the degree requirements have been met, and the certificate is to be awarded. Scanned documents are acceptable
 - Applicants who have not fulfilled all requirements for their degree at the time of application must do so prior to commencing the Fellowship. In this case, a letter from the supervisor/department or final exam committee confirming the expected defense and program completion date is to be provided.
 - All documents submitted must be in English, as well as the original language in which they were written. A
 certified translator, not yourself, must prepare the English version of any documents not originally in English
 - Transcripts are not required
- **7) Proposed UofA Supervisor Letter of Support:** to be included with the full application (does not have to be emailed to GPS separately)
 - Letter must be signed by the proposed UofA research supervisor and be on institutional letterhead (electronic signatures are acceptable). Note: the proposed supervisor (and/or co-supervisor if applicable) cannot also provide a Letter of Appraisal.
 - If you also have a co-supervisor, only one Letter of Support will be accepted by either the supervisor or cosupervisor
- 8) Biographical Sketch Form: from the U of A primary research supervisor
 - The Supervisor is to complete the required Biosketch Form (must be in this format)
 - If you also have a co-supervisor, only the Biosketch form from the supervisor is required
- 9) Arrange for Three Letters of Appraisal: from persons familiar with your academic work. As these letters are confidential, they are to be sent directly to the Chair (or delegate) of the department to which you are applying; letters sent by email are acceptable
 - Must not include a letter from the proposed supervisor (or co-supervisor) as a Letter of Support is already provided
 - Only have three appraisals sent. Any additional letters will be removed prior to the competition
 - All letters of appraisal must be signed by the appraiser and be on institutional letterhead (electronic image signatures are acceptable). They should contain a substantive evaluation of your ability and not be merely testimonials, as the fellowships are intended primarily for those who are seeking to establish themselves in their chosen field
 - Letters must be in English, or if in another language, a certified translation included with the original language
 - Applicants are responsible for supplying their referees with the documents necessary for them to write their respective letters
 - Applicants should contact their referees well in advance of the application deadline date.
 - It is the applicant's responsibility to follow up with referees to ensure the assessments are submitted in sufficient time prior to the department internal deadline
