- Administered by International Education and Enrolment (IEE), this endowment will fund an award that will:
 1. enhance students' knowledge of international relations and development, in such areas as diplomacy, conflict, trade and cultural relations as well as Canada's role in advancing world peace and economic development.
 2. advance students' career in international relations and development.
- You must submit the following:
 1. This application form that answers the following three questions (with reference to the goals of the award, as defined above):
 - i) How do your studies and/or research project focus on international relations and development as described above?
 - ii) Describe your own involvement in international relations and development through your academic and volunteering experiences.
 - iii) How will this project affect your long term plans and goals in the field of international relations and development?
 2. Two academic references. Please note that reference letters should focus on the research project as well as your own background in international relations and development;
 3. University of Alberta transcripts including your Fall 2025 and Winter 2025 grades. If you attended another post-secondary institution in Winter 2025, please include your transcript from that institution; and
 4. Declaration Form.
